Crochet dress



In this pattern there will be several options on what it is that you want to crocheting, it all depends on when you stop. First there will be a bra/bralette, then a top and if you want it to be a tight top then you don't increase at all or just fewer rows, or if you want it to be a top that's wider then you keep on increasing and stop when you reach the desired length of the top. Then it becomes a dress a short one, to the knees or like me a maxi dress, as I said it all depends on when you stop crocheting.

Truought this pattern it is important to put the pieces on and see how you like it. I did this especially when I decided on the increases that's being made, when I was done with them I thought that I made to many because as a top it looked to big but it turned out exactly like I wanted it to when it started to become a dress.

I have a video on my igtv were I show how to start the fsc and the fsc to start the strap. I have written (video) in the pattern when its time to look at it. @lisettelannerhag

when you come to row 18 you are going to continue on making hdc for 56 row, however if you want a top instead of a dress you can stop at any time you like.

If the pattern says “rows from st marker” that means that you count the row that the st marker is in as well.

Us terms abbreviations

Turning chains never count as a st.

Crochet terms:

Fsc = foundation single crochet

Ch = chains

St = stitches

Inc = increase (2 hdc is made in the same st)

Sl st = slip stitch

Hdc = Half double crochet

Sizes:

XS(S)M(L)XL(XXL)XXXL

Measurements:

bust is approximately: 33(36)41(49)51(56)62 cm.

Length approximately: 126 cm.

I only measure the front of the piece not all the way around.

Gauge:

1: Fsc 12, ch 2, 12 hdc, turn.

2: Ch 2, 12 hdc, turn.

Crochet row 1-2 until you have 9 rows in total.

Where you fsc 12 is the length: 9 - 10 hdc = 5 cm.

Width: 8 hdc = 5 cm.

Yarn:

Sandnes Garn Mandarin Naturell 450(500)600(660)790(850)890 g.

50 g = 130 m

Drops safran

Hook:

3,0 or what you need to fit the gauge.

Bra/bralette:

1: fsc 19, turn. Place st marker. (picture 1)

*2: ch 2, 2 sc inc, 15 hdc, 3 sc, turn. down

3: ch 1, 3 sc, 16 hdc, 2 sc inc, turn.* (picture 2) up

Crochet row: *2-3* until you have:10(10) 12(14)16(18)20 from st marker the st are going to keep on increasing (picture 3)

Strap:

- 1: ch 1, 3 sc, 26 hdc or until you have 2 st left, 2 sc inc, fsc: 60 **important to measure out the strap to see if you like the length, the length off the strap is going to fold back to the back piece off the dress and all testers have made different amount off fsc.** turn. (Picture 4 shows which st to start your fsc in) (picture 5 also shows were to start your fsc) (video)
- 2: ch 1, 60 sc or as many fsc you did + 1 sc, place a st marker 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn. (picture 6)
- 3: ch 1, 3 sc, 28 hdc or until st marker, 13 sc, 2 sc tog, turn. (picture 7)
- 4: ch 1, 2 sc tog, 12 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 sc left, 3 sc, turn.
- 5:ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc or until st marker, 10 sc, 2 sc tog, turn.
- 6: ch 1, 2 sc tog, 9 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 sc left, 3 sc, turn. (picture 8)
- 7: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc or until st marker, 7 sc, 2 sc tog, turn.
- 8: ch 1, 2 sc tog, 6 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 sc left, 3 sc, turn. **Xs, s stops here**
- 9: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc or until st marker, 3 sc, 2 sc tog, turn.
- 10: ch 1, 2 sc tog, 2 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 sc left, 3 sc, turn. **M stops here**
L,XL,XXL,XXXL keeps crocheting like this until you have 2 sc left until st marker. (picture 9)

Middle:

*1: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc or until st marker, 2 sc, turn. Place a st marker.

2: ch 1, 2 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn.* (picture 10)

Crochet row: *1-2* until you have: 24(26)30(34)38(42)46 rows from st marker. Before you continue on, I want you to measure this out on you to see how you like the fit and adjust if needed. (picture 11)

Strap 2:

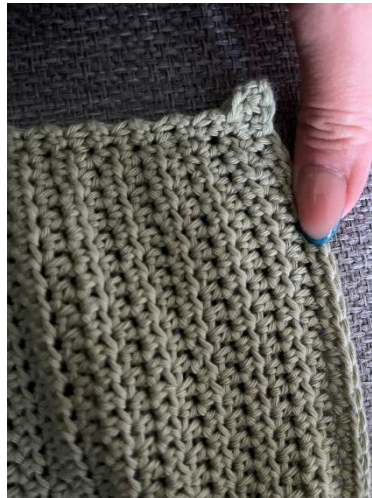
1: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 1 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc 1, turn. (picture 12)

2: ch 1, 2 sc inc, 2 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn. (picture 13)

3: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 3 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc 2, turn.
 4: ch 1, 7 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn. (picture 14)
 5: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 6 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc 2, turn.
 6: ch 1, 10 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn **xs,s stops here**
 7: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 9 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc 2, turn.
 8: ch 1, 13 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn. **M stops here**
 9: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 12 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc 2, turn.
 10: ch 1, 16 sc, 27 hdc or until you have 3 st left, 3 sc, turn. **L stops here**
XL,XXL,XXXL keeps crocheting like this until this side matches the other side of the strap.

Strap 2 continue:

1: ch 1, 3 sc, 27 hdc, 12 sc, 2 sc inc, fsc (since all sizes is going to have different amount off st now you measure this part with the other strap and make as many fsc as you did in the first 1 so that they match), turn. (Picture 15,16)
 2: ch 1, 32 sc, 27 hdc. 3 sc, turn.

*3: ch 1, 3 sc, 26 hdc, 2 sc tog, turn. (Picture 17) place a st marker
 4: ch 1, 2 sc tog, 25 hdc, 3 sc, turn.*

Crochet row: *3-4* until you have:10(10) 12(14)16(18)20 from st marker the st are going to keep on decreasing (picture 18, 19)

Backpiece:

*1: ch 1, 3 sc, 14 hdc, 2 sc, turn. place st marker.
 2: ch 1, 2 sc, 14 hdc, 3 sc, turn.*

Crochet row: *1-2* until you have: 45(49)53(57)61(65)69 rows in total from st marker.
Measure this out on you, you might need more/less rows.(Picture 20)

Assembling:

count 5 rows from the start of the back of the top and sew together your straps there, or fold the straps to the back piece and see where you would want to sew together them. (Picture 21) also sew together the backpiece.

Border:

Fasten yarn in the back in between the straps. (Picture 22)

1: ch 2, skip 1 st, *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1 st, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1 st* crochet like this all around the top and the straps. We do not turn we keep on crocheting in the round. (picture 23)

2: *ch 3, sl st in the hdc below, ch 3, sl st in the hdc below* crochet like this all around the top and the straps. We do not turn we keep on crocheting in the round. (picture 24)

Do row 1 and 2 around the other side of the straps and under the boobs.

If you are making a dress then crochet row 2 under the boobs like this: ch 3, sc in the hdc below, ch 3, sc in the hdc below* crochet like this all around

Let's make this a dress:

From now on we do not ch and turn, we just keep on crocheting in the rounds however important to place a st marker where you began so you know when the new row is starting. I want you to try on the bra before you continue on, most testers found the bralette to be a bit short but this will be lengthened by the weight of the dress/top. In rows below we are going to increase in some of the rows however it's up to you to decide when you want to stop increasing, I'm going to write down how I did and when I stopped but it is important to try it on now and then to see when you want to stop increasing the dress. You might have to stop before or continue on after me.

1: hdc in the middle of the 3 chain below and in the sc below all around.

2: we are going to make increase every 10 st this row: 1 hdc 2hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc – repeat this all around the dress. If you don't have 9 st until next increase in the end then finish off with an increase.

3: crochet hdc in every stitch this row.

4: we are going to make increase every 10 st this row: 1 hdc 2hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc – repeat this all around the dress. If you don't have 9 st until next increase in the end then finish off with an increase.

5: ch 3, 1 sc in the st below, ch 3, 1 sc in the hdc below* crochet like this all around, since we been increasing you are going to crochet in the chain or in the hdc its important to only skip 1 st. (Picture 25)

6: hdc in the middle of the 3 chain below and in the sc below all around no increases.

7: we are going to make increase every 10 st this row:, 1 hdc 2hdcinc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc – repeat this all around the dress. If you don't have 9 st until next increase in the end then finish of with an increase.

8: crochet hdc in every stich this row.

9: we are going to make increase every 10 st this row: 1 hdc 2hdcinc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, (9 st) 2 hdc inc – repeat this all around the dress. If you don't have 9 st until next increase in the end then finish of with an increase.

10: ch 3, 1 sc in the st below, ch 3, 1 sc in the hdc below* crochet like this all around, since we been increasing you are going to crochet in the chain or in the hdc its important to only skip 1 st.

11: hdc in the middle of the 3 chain below and in the hdc below all around.

12: 2 hdc inc, 9 hdc, 2 hdc inc 9 hdc, – repeat this all around the dress. If you don't have 9 st until next increase in the end then finish of with an increase. I will stop increasing now.

13: 1 hdc, ch1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1, skip 1, all around.

14: crochet hdc in every stitch this row.

15: 1 hdc, ch1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1, skip1, all around.

16: crochet hdc in every stitch this row.

17: 1 hdc, ch1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1, skip1, all around. Its starting to look like a top, if you want it to be a top then make a few of row 18 and then stop. (Picture 26)

18: crochet hdc in every stitch this row and for 49 more rows.

(picture 27, 28 this is a cute top, I think this is 20 rows of row 18, you can totally stop here)

We now have a short dress if you want to you can stop here or if you want it longer then let's continue. (Picture 29, that's 49 rows of row 18)

Long dress:

I want to have a slit in my dress so I'm going to place a blue st marker where the slit is going to be (picture) when I get to the st marker I'm going to turn and keep on crocheting to the st marker the other way. I will repeat this for every row from now on. If you want to have 2 slits on each side then place 2 st markers on each side and make one panel at a time.

- 1: ch 2, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc until st marker. Turn.
- 2: ch 3, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1, 1 hdc in ch space, until st marker. Finish off with a hdc in the ch 2 from below. Turn.
- 3: ch 2, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1, 1 hdc in ch space, until st marker. Finish off with a hdc in the ch 2 from below. Turn.
- 4: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn. (Picture 30)

- 5: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.
- 6: ch 2 *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn
- 7: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn
- 8: ch 2, *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn.
- 9: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn
- 10: ch 2,*1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn.
- 11: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.
- 12: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.
- 13: ch 2, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc until st marker. Turn.
- 14: ch 3, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1, 1 hdc in ch space, until st marker. Finish off with a hdc in the ch 2 from below. Turn.
- 15: ch 3, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1, 1 hdc in ch space, until st marker. Finish off with a hdc in the ch 2 from below. Turn.
- 16: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.
- 17: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.
- 18: ch 2 *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn
- 19: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn
- 20: ch 2, *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn.
- 21: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn
- 22: ch 2, *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* until st marker. Turn.
- 23: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn.

24: ch 2, hdc until st marker, turn. (picture 31)

Lace:

1: ch 2 *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* . Turn

2: ch 2 *1 hdc in ch space, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1 skip 1,* . Turn

Repeat row 2 for 8 rows.

10: ch 2, hdc all st, turn.

11: ch 2 *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* . Turn

12: ch 2 *1 hdc in ch space, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc in ch space, ch 1 skip 1,* . Turn

13: 10: ch 2, hdc all st, turn.

14: ch 2 *1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1, 1 hdc, ch 1 skip 1,* . Turn

Repeat row 14 for 22 rows. (Picture 32,33)

36: ch 2, hdc all st, fasten off.

Assembling:

If you have any yarn to sew in than do that otherwise your beautiful maxidress is done.
