### Materials You'll Need:

Yarn of your choice Crochet hook suitable for your yarn Scissors Yarn needle

### Pattern:

*Round 1:* Start by chaining 3. In the first chain, create 2 double crochets. Then, chain 3, make 3 double crochets—repeat this pattern 2 more times. Afterward, chain 3 and slip stitch to join in the top of the initial chain. Fasten off. (12 double crochets, 4 chain-2 spaces)





*Round 2:* Join a new color in the corner chain-2 space. Begin by chaining 4, which counts as a single crochet and a chain-3. In the same space, make 1 single crochet. Chain 3, in the next chain-2 space, create [single crochet, chain 3, single crochet]—repeat this pattern 2 more times. Then, chain 3 and slip stitch to join in the first beginning chain. Fasten off. (8 single crochets, 8 chain-3 spaces)





Round 2

*Round 3:* To start this round, join a new color in the corner chain-3 space. Chain 2 and, in the same space, create [2 double crochets, chain 2, 3 double crochets]. In the next chain-3 space, make 3 double crochets. In the next corner chain-3 space, create [3 double crochets, chain 2, 3 double crochets]. In the following chain-3 space, make 3 double crochets—repeat this pattern to the end. Join in the top of the initial chain-2 and fasten off. (36 double crochets, 4 chain-2 spaces)





Round 3

*Round 4:* Begin this round by joining a new color in the corner chain-2 space. Chain 4, which counts as a single crochet and a chain-3. In the same space, make 1 single crochet. Chain 3, and in the space between each set of 3 double crochet stitches, make a single crochet—repeat this pattern to the next corner. In the corner chain-2 space, create [single crochet, chain 3, single crochet]. [Chain 3, single crochet in the space between each set of 3 double crochet stitches] until you reach the next corner—repeat this pattern to the end. Join and fasten off. (16 single crochets, 16 chain-3 spaces)





#### Round 4

*Round 5:* Join a new color in the corner chain-3 space. Chain 2 and, in the same space, create [2 double crochets, chain 2, 3 double crochets]. In the next chain-3 space, make 3 double crochets—repeat this pattern to the next corner. In the corner chain-3 space, create [3 double crochets, chain 2, 3 double crochets]. Make 3 double crochets in each chain-3 space until you reach the next corner—repeat this pattern to the end. Join and fasten off. (60 double crochets, 4 chain-2 spaces)





Round 5

Round 6: Repeat Round 4. (24 single crochets, 24 chain-3 spaces)



Round 7: Repeat Round 5. (84 double crochets, 4 chain-2 spaces)
