This stitch is known for its loose texture, but to maintain the desired level of flexibility and comfort, it's advisable to opt for a crochet hook that's a few sizes larger than the standard recommendation for the yarn you're using. This ensures that your stitches won't become overly tight. The objective here is to strike a balance between a blanket that drapes gracefully and offers that delightful, plush coziness.

Materials You'll Need

Before we dive into the project, let's gather the materials you'll need:

Tunisian crochet hook: Choose a hook size that corresponds with your yarn weight. A 6.0 mm or 6.5 mm hook is suitable for worsted-weight yarn.

Yarn: Select a soft, durable yarn in your preferred colors. For this project, you can use a single color or a combination of colors for stripes. Approximately 1,800-2,000 yards of yarn should be enough for an average-sized blanket.

Yarn needle: This will be used for weaving in ends and seaming, if necessary.

Scissors: For cutting yarn.

Abbreviations:

st(s) – stitch(es)

sl st - slip st

ch – chain stitch

yo - yarn over

TSS – Tunisian Simple Stitch: (forward pass) insert hook behind the front vertical bar, yarn over and bring up a loop, leaving the loop on the hook.

MC - main color

C1 - Slate

C2 - Hudson Bay

C3 - Glacier



Pattern Instructions

Chain 60 stitches.

Row 1 (Foundation row, forward): (MC)Start from the second chain from the hook, insert the hook into the back bump, yarn over (YO), pull up a loop, and leave the loop on the hook. Repeat this process from * to complete the first forward pass. Do not turn at the end of the row.

Row 1 (Foundation row, reverse): [MC] Yarn over (YO), pull the yarn through one loop. YO, pull the yarn through two loops. Repeat from * to complete the first reverse pass. This counts as the first row in the color chart. (60 sts)

Rows 2-6: [MC] (Forward pass) Tunisian Simple Stitch (TSS) across the row. (Reverse pass) YO, pull the yarn through one loop.

Row 7: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in Color 1 (C1), using MC to YO and pull through the last 2 loops.

Row 8: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in MC, using C1 to YO and pulling through the last 2 loops.



Rows 9-10: Repeat Rows 7-8. Cut MC after Row 10, leaving a 6-inch tail.

Rows 11-16: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in C1, using MC to YO and pull through the last 2 loops of Row 16.

Row 17: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in MC, using C1 to YO and pulling through the last 2 loops.

Row 18: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in C1, using MC to YO and pull through the last 2 loops.

Rows 19-20: Repeat Rows 17-18. Cut C1 after Row 20, leaving a 6-inch tail.

Rows 21-23: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in MC, using Color 2 (C2) to YO and pull through the last 2 loops of Row 23.

Rows 24-27: Repeat Rows 7-10, replacing C1 with C2. Cut MC after Row 27, leaving a 6-inch tail.

Rows 28-32: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in C2, using MC to YO and pull through the last 2 loops of Row 32.

Rows 33-39: Repeat Rows 17-23, replacing C1 with C2. Cut C2 after Row 36, leaving a 6-inch tail.

Rows 40-53: Repeat Rows 7-20, replacing C1 with Color 3 (C3). Cut MC after Row 43 and cut C3 after Row 53, leaving 6-inch tails.

Rows 54-80: Work TSS forward and reverse passes in MC.

Row 81 (Bind off): [MC] Insert your hook under the next vertical bar, YO, and pull through both the vertical bar and the loop on the hook, similar to a slip stitch. Repeat this process across the row.
