crochet).

Work 5 single crochets into the magic ring. Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet. Tighten the ring and fasten off. You should have 6 single crochets in this round.

Round 2: Adding More Color and Doubling the Stitches

Switch to your next color of yarn.

Join it in any stitch with a slip stitch, then chain 1 (which counts as 1 single crochet).

Work 1 single crochet in the same stitch (at the base of the chain 1).

Continue by making 2 single crochets in each stitch around.

Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet.

Fasten off.

In this round, you'll have 12 single crochets.

Round 3: Expanding the Flower Petals

Using your next color, join it in any stitch with a slip stitch.

Chain 1, which counts as 2 single crochets.

Make 1 single crochet in the next stitch.

Now, repeat the pattern: 2 single crochets in the next stitch, then 1 single crochet in the next stitch.

Continue this pattern all the way around.

Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet.

Fasten off.

You'll have 18 single crochets in this round.

Round 4: Growing the Flower

Switch to your next color and join it in any stitch with a slip stitch.

Chain 1 (which counts as 2 single crochets).

Make 1 single crochet in the next 2 stitches.

Repeat: 2 single crochets in the next stitch, then 1 single crochet in the next 2 stitches.

Continue this pattern all the way around.

Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet.

Fasten off.

You'll now have 24 single crochets in this round.

Round 5: Adding More Color and Stitches

Using your next color, join it in any stitch with a slip stitch.

Chain 1 (which counts as 2 single crochets).

Make 1 single crochet in the next 3 stitches.

Repeat: 2 single crochets in the next stitch, then 1 single crochet in the next 3 stitches.

Continue this pattern all the way around.

Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet.

Fasten off.

You should now have 30 single crochets in this round.



Round 6: Expanding the Flower Further

Switch to your next color and join it in any stitch with a slip stitch.

Chain 1 (which counts as 2 single crochets).

Make 1 single crochet in the next 4 stitches.

Repeat: 2 single crochets in the next stitch, then 1 single crochet in the next 4 stitches.

Continue this pattern all the way around.

Join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet.

Fasten off.

You'll have 36 single crochets in this round.

Round 7: Petal Details

Using your next color, join it in any stitch with a slip stitch.

Chain 1 and create a dc2tog (double crochet two together) over the same stitch and the next stitch.

Chain 1.

Slip stitch into the same stitch.

Now, repeat this pattern: slip stitch into the next stitch, chain 1, dc2tog over the same stitch and the next stitch, chain 1, slip stitch into the same stitch.

Continue this pattern all the way around.

Join with a slip stitch to the beginning chain 1. Fasten off.
