Tutorial

Foundation Row: Begin by chaining multiples of 4 until you reach the desired width, adding 1 additional chain for turning.

Row 1: Start by working 3 double crochets (DC) into the fifth chain from the hook. Then, repeat the pattern 3 DC, chain 1, skip 3 stitches, 3 DC across the row. When only 4 stitches remain, chain 1, skip 3 stitches, and create 2 DC in the last chain.

Row 2: Chain 2 and turn your work. Within each chain space across, perform the following sequence: 1 DC, 1 DC spike into the center stitch of the row below, 1 DC, chain 1. Complete the row by making 2 DC in the initial chain-2 space from the previous row .

Row 3: Chain 2 and turn your work. Similar to Row 2, in each chain space across, follow this pattern: 1 DC, 1 DC spike into the center stitch of the row below, 1 DC, chain 1. Finish the row by making 2 DC in the starting chain-2 space from the previous row.

Rows 4 and onwards: Continue repeating Row 3 for as many rows as you desire for your project's length.
