Materials You'll Need

Before we begin, let's gather the materials you'll need for this project:

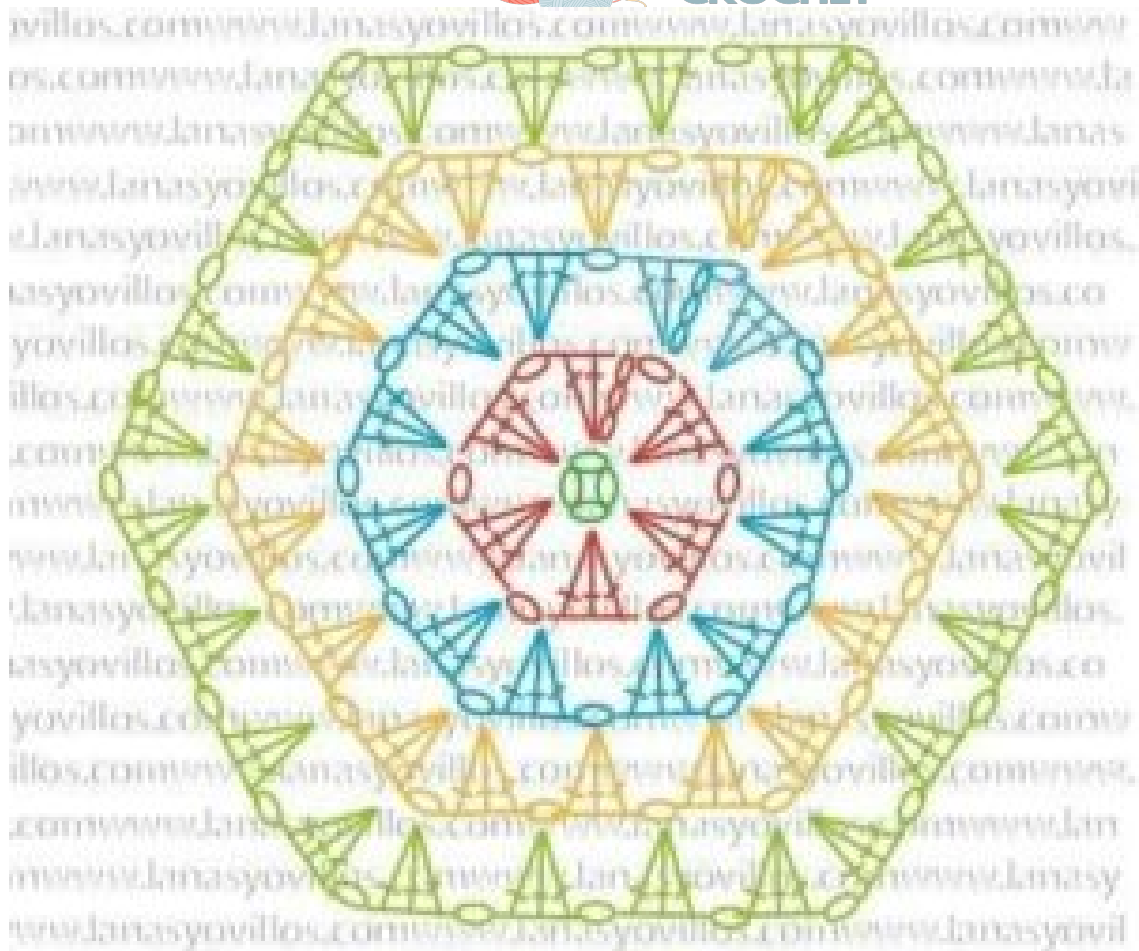
Yarn: Choose your preferred color(s) and weight of yarn. Granny hexagons are perfect for using up yarn scraps or creating a coordinated color palette.

Scissors: For cutting yarn.

Yarn Needle: Used for weaving in loose ends and joining hexagons if you're working on a larger project.

Abbreviations:

- Beg: beginning
- Ch: chain
- Sl st: slip stitch
- St: stitch
- Dc: double crochet
- Rep: repeat
- Sp: space

Tutorial:

Let's create a beautiful crochet granny hexagon with these step-by-step instructions:

Step 1: Forming the Center Ring

Begin by chaining 4 (abbreviated as Ch 4). Once you have your chain, join the last chain to the first to create a ring.

Round 1: Establishing the Hexagon

Chain 3 (Ch 3), which serves as your first double crochet (dc). Add 2 more double crochets (2 dc) into the center ring. Chain 1 (Ch 1) to create a space. Now, repeat the following sequence five times: 3 dc into the center ring, followed by Ch 1. After completing all six sets, join the round by making a slip stitch (sl st) into the third chain (3rd ch) of the beginning chain 3 (beg ch 3). Fasten off by cutting the yarn and securing it.



Round 1

Round 2: Building the Corners

To begin this round, join your next yarn in any of the chain-1 spaces (ch-1 sp) from the previous round. Chain 3 (Ch 3), and within the same space, work 2 double crochets (2 dc). Chain 1 (Ch 1) to create a space. Now, in the next ch-1 space, crochet 3 double crochets (3 dc), followed by Ch 1. Repeat this sequence around the hexagon five more times. To complete the round, join by making a slip stitch (sl st) into the third chain (3rd ch) of the beginning chain 3 (beg ch 3). Fasten off.



Round 2

Round 3: Expanding the Sides

Join your next yarn in any of the chain-1 spaces (ch-1 sp) from the previous round. Chain 3 (Ch 3), then work 1 double crochet (1 dc) into the same space. Chain 1 (Ch 1) to create a space. This is your first corner. In the next space, crochet 3 double crochets (3 dc). Continue alternating between creating corners (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) and working 3 double crochets (3 dc) in the spaces between corners. Repeat this pattern around the hexagon five more times. To complete the round, join by making a slip stitch (sl st) into the third chain (3rd ch) of the beginning chain 3 (beg ch 3). Fasten off.



Round 3

Round 4: Adding Detail

Join your next yarn in any of the chain-1 spaces (ch-1 sp) from the previous round. Chain 3 (Ch 3), and work 1 double crochet (1 dc) into the same space. Chain 1 (Ch 1) to create a space, establishing the first corner. Now, work 3 double crochets (3 dc) into the next space, then repeat this sequence once more. For the corners, crochet (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) into the corner spaces. Continue the pattern by working 3 double crochets (3 dc) between corners, repeating this sequence around the hexagon five more times. To complete the round, join by making a slip stitch (sl st) into the third chain (3rd ch) of the beginning chain 3 (beg ch 3). Fasten off.



Round 4

Expanding Your Hexagon

If you wish to make a larger hexagon, simply add more rounds. To do so, incorporate an additional group of three double crochets (3 dc) on each side while maintaining the (2 dc, ch 1, 2 dc) pattern in each corner. This will expand your granny hexagon while preserving its charming symmetry.
