Materials Needed

Tutorial

Create a magic ring and chain 1.



Round 1: Work 4 single crochet stitches (sc) into the magic ring. (4 stitches)

Round 2: Double the stitches in each stitch around by working 2 sc in each one. (8 stitches)

Round 3: Repeat the pattern of (2 sc in the next stitch, followed by 1 sc in the next stitch) four times. (12 stitches)

Round 4: Work 1 sc in each stitch around. (12 stitches)

Round 5: Repeat the pattern of (2 sc in the next stitch, followed by 1 sc in the next 5 stitches) twice. (14 stitches)

Round 6: Repeat the pattern of (2 sc in the next stitch, followed by 1 sc in the next 6 stitches) twice. (16 stitches)

Rounds 7-8: Continue working 1 sc in each stitch around. (16 stitches)

Round 9: Perform a decrease (invdec) stitch, followed by 1 sc in the next 6 stitches, and repeat this sequence one more time. (14 stitches)

Round 10: Perform an invdec, followed by 1 sc in the next 5 stitches, and repeat this sequence one more time. (12 stitches)

Round 11: Complete an invdec, followed by 1 sc in the next 4 stitches, then another invdec, 1 sc in the next 3 stitches, and finally, a slip stitch (sl st) in the next stitch. (10 stitches)

Fasten off your work.
